DID YOU KNOW ...

While P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s Annual General Meeting and Board and Executive Committee meetings are held in Toronto, Ontario, many Adopt-A-School sponsors reside outside the city of Toronto. Sponsorships come from friends of Jamaica and people of Jamaican heritage who reside in

There are more than 2,600 registered Early Childhood Institutions / Basic Schools in Jamaica. Any of these schools can be adopted through P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s Adopt-A-School program. There are currently 321 of these schools adopted throughout Jamaica's 14 parishes. Some schools have more than 1 sponsor and some sponsors have adopted more than 1 school.

P.A.C.E. (Canada) provides schools with their sponsors' names but no contact information. Sponsors are provided with contact information for their schools and are encouraged to visit and to communicate with their adopted schools.

Approximately 45% of Early Childhood Practitioners (teachers in Early Childhood Institutions / Basic Schools) do not meet the minimum level of qualification (Level 2) as called for in the standards defined by Jamaica's Early Childhood Commission (ECC). That's why, since 2011, P.A.C.E. (Canada) has partnered with the ECC and HEART, Jamaica's National Training Agency, to subsidize Level 2 training and certification for early childhood practitioners. To-date, 48 early childhood practitioners have been certified through this partnership, with a commitment to an additional 50 over the next 12 to 18 months. While priority is given to early childhood practitioners in schools sponsored through P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s Adopt-A-School program, practitioners from other Early Childhood Institutions / Basic Schools are also eligible for subsidized training and certification through this program.

Another Successful Adopt-A-School Brunch

P.A.C.E. (Canada) hosted another successful Adopt-A-School Brunch on Sunday, November 17 at the Hilton Suites Conference Centre in Markham.

President of P.A.C.E. (Canada), Dr. Mary Anne Chambers, who presided over her last Adopt-A-School Brunch as President, highlighted some of the accomplishments achieved during her tenure.

"More than 100 schools have been able to acquire playground equipment; more than 55 schools have installed toilets, urinals and wash basins; 100 early childhood practitioners have been given the opportunity to receive formal training and certification; more than 340 boxes of school supplies have been purchased from Sangster's Book Store and delivered to adopted basic schools and early childhood institutions; more than CDN


\$400,000 in sponsorship donations have been provided to adopted basic schools and early childhood centres in Jamaica and Canada; creative state of the art learning resources for the provision of parenting education programs and early childhood curriculum

workshops have been funded for resource centres in each parish; and 45,000 workbooks have been produced and delivered to basic schools and early childhood institutions.

Dr. Chambers informed guests that a donation 2 years ago of CDN\$50,000 by the Carpenters' District Council of Ontario became the seed money for the creation of an Early Childhood Centre and Practicing School at Sam Sharpe Teacher's College just outside Montego Bay. When opened in 2014, it will also serve as a special needs assessment and intervention centre for children living in northwest Jamaica and who will no longer have to travel all the way to Kingston to seek help.

Guest speaker was Canada's High Commissioner to Jamaica, His Excellency Robert Ready, who gave a wide-ranging speech on his first year serving in Jamaica and on Canada/Jamaica relations.

He noted that the leadership in both countries understands the importance of the relationship. He said the Jamaican leadership is well connected to Canada through their own Canadian experiences and the Jamaican diaspora, while Canadian leadership recognizes the positive contribution Jamaicans have had and continue to have in Canada. The high commissioner said Canada's priorities in Jamaica are to create economic opportunity; support security and justice; and foster people-to-people ties, especially in the health and education fields.





High Commissioner Ready has visited several basic schools in Jamaica, noting that the visits "really touched me". He told the audience that the schools reminded him of photographs from "my dad who began his career in education in a one-room school in the wilds of North Frontenac county."

The high commissioner said he was proud to be serving Canada in Jamaica, and he's having a great time enjoying every minute and meeting some of the best people in the world.

Jamaica's High Commissioner to Canada, Her Excellency Sheila Sealy Monteith, brought greetings on behalf of the Jamaican government. She expressed gratitude for the assistance that P.A.C.E. (Canada) has been giving to Jamaican children, parents and early childhood practitioners. The high commissioner who was named as P.A.C.E.'s first Honorary Patron in 2012, said investing in early childhood education was equipping schools appropriately.


Grade Six student, Ayo Adereti, received a standing ovation when she spoke about giving children the right conditions to develop and make their dreams a reality.

Your Annual Membership Fees are Important

Who are requested to pay Membership Fees?

With the exception of Patrons and Life Members, anyone who supports the work of P.A.C.E. (Canada) is requested to pay an annual Membership Fee.

Why are Membership Fees requested?

Membership Fees help to cover the administrative costs of our volunteer-run organization. Administrative fees are not deducted from money designated for schools through the Adopt-A-School Program.

Does P.A.C.E. (Canada) have an office?

No. P.A.C.E. (Canada) rents mailboxes for letters and packages, voicemail and email. We also have a website. Volunteers work from their homes and meetings are held at the Consulate General of Jamaica in Toronto.

What other kinds of administrative expenses are there?

Other kinds of administrative expenses are bookkeeping, end of year accounting review, stationery and postage for correspondence with schools and donors, stationery and postage for tax receipts, production and mailing of newsletters, printing of donation forms, bank fees.

When should Membership Fees be paid?

P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s financial year is April 1st to March 31st, however, Membership is tracked to the date of your last payment. Fees can be paid at any time during the year and are effective for one year. Adopt-A-School Sponsors are encouraged to pay the Membership Fee at the same time that they are establishing or renewing their Sponsorship.

Will I receive a Tax Receipt for my Membership Fee? Yes. Membership Fees are Donations to P.A.C.E. (Canada).

How much are the Membership Fees?

Annual Membership Fees are \$40 per individual, \$60 per family, \$15 per youth / student.



Making A Difference

... IN JAMAICA

ADOPT-A-SCHOOL SPONSORSHIPS and SCHOOL SUPPLIES

P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s Adopt-A-School sponsors are helping to provide healthier and safer environments and a higher quality of education for thousands of little girls and boys in Basic Schools / Early Childhood Institutions in Jamaica. Disbursements are made in the Spring (March) and in the Fall (September), each year.

On receiving their cheques, the schools are required to complete an *Official Receipt* form and an *Information for Sponsors* form, which, along with items such as photographs and samples of the children's work, are sent by P.A.C.E. (Canada) to the sponsors of the particular schools. The September 2013 disbursement was comprised of:

Adopt-A-School Sponsorship Funds for 122 schools - \$56,777.60

Funds to purchase **Boxes of School Supplies** from Sangster's Book Store in Jamaica, for delivery to 41 schools - **\$4,500**



In addition to Adopt-A-School Sponsorships and School Supplies, the September 2013 disbursement included a very special **donation from Royal Bank of Canada** which was allocated to 40 schools that had identified the need for **Toilets, Urinals and Wash Basins - \$10,000**



Proceeds from fundraising events have enabled P.A.C.E. (Canada) to continue support for teacher training in Jamaica. In September 2013, P.A.C.E. (Canada) signed a second Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with HEART Trust / NTA, Jamaica's National Training Agency, and Jamaica's Early Childhood Commission (ECC) to support the training and Level 2 certification of up to 50 additional early childhood practitioners. While these practitioners have already been teaching children in Basic Schools and Early Childhood Institutions, for most this will be their first formal training and certification in early childhood education. Training under the second MOU is scheduled to commence between February 2014 and April 2014 at centres in Petersfield (Westmoreland), Port Maria (St. Mary), Old Harbour (St. Catherine) and Kingston. P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s commitment to the second MOU - \$15,000

SAM SHARPE TEACHERS' COLLEGE EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRE

Planning is underway for the construction of this Centre which will also serve as a Practicing School for students at the College and a Special Needs Assessment and Intervention Centre for children in the northern and western parishes of Jamaica.

P.A.C.E. (Canada)'s commitment to this project - \$108,000


