

Dr. Inez Elliston

Sunrise: Aug 17, 1930 Sunset: February 7, 2017

Dr. Elliston was an initial Patron of P.A.C.E. (Canada) and attended the very first P.A.C.E. event, a Toy Drive in 1987. The Dr. Elliston Living Legacy Bursary Award provided for college Students enrolled in Early Childhood Education in Canada. Since 1999 she sponsored the Manchester Mile Gully Basic School (renamed to Sydney L. Blake Basic School).



Raphaelita Walker

Sunrise: Dec 12, 1926 Sunset: Feb 14, 2017

Affectionately called Aunt Raph, she was a founding member of Women for P.A.C.E. Canada. She had been a Board Member since 1994 and a Life Member, and was awarded the P.A.C.E. Canada Founder's Trophy in 2007. Aunt Raph remained active in PACE until her death. Since 1991 she sponsored the High Holborn Street Basic School and Charles Chin-loy Early Childhood Institute.

Professor McLeod was a P.A.C.E. member and school sponsor since 1987; recipient of

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Katie Bears



KatieBears was in Jamaica in February 2017 to see both of the schools we have adopted through PACE Canada.

We were very fortunate to take six of our volunteers with us this year. Some of them have never been out of Canada so it was such an exciting adventure. They could not believe every-

thing that they have helped KatieBears accomplish so far. They are all very motivated to do more now that they have seen both of the schools.

Our first stop was Upper Top Lincoln ECI in Grange Hill. We were so very pleased to see they have started to update the washrooms. There is now two separate areas for the toilets. Previously both toilets were in the same space with no divider between them. They have also installed the new 650 gallon water storage tank. We were greeted by all the children with big smiles and hugs for all of us. Our volunteers handed out new KatieBears to each of the children and of course some sweeties to each as well. We also brought school supplies, first aid supplies, new story books and loads of love and encouragement.

Our second stop was at Dalmally Basic School in Dias. This was the first school that KatieBears adopted and we are so excited with all the upgrades over the 5 years we have been helping out. This past year we added another 650 gallon water storage tank and a new stove for the kitchen. They have purchased a television to assist with learning techniques too. It was unfortunate to hear that the fridge was broken when we were there, but we had a very generous donation that will allow KatieBears to purchase that immediately. They have now installed a fence around the school and only need to purchase a gate to finish it off. Of course our volunteers handed out KatieBears and loads of other items for all the children. Dalmally Basic was celebrating Jamaica Day and all the children had songs and dance to perform for us. Many parents were in attendance that day as well, it was very nice to meet many of the families.

We will continue supporting these two schools for many years and can't wait to see the difference it will make in these children's lives.

KatieBears goal is to have 10 supported schools all fixed up so the children will have a great place to grow and learn.


